The Curtain Is Going Up On The Chicago Bar Association's Annual "Bar Show" Musical Extravaganza

They practice law by day, but more than 50 Chicago-area attorneys will be hitting the stage after business hours to perform a rousing musical comedy revue that parodies local and national political figures in the Chicago Bar Association's annual Bar Show opening in downtown Chicago November 29.

No one is off limits in this irreverent production that features skits and musical numbers lampooning politicians, show biz, and public figures who made news and headlines over the past year. The show is written, directed and performed by a cast and crew of lawyers who also have backgrounds in music or theater, including Chicago and community theatre performers, classical musicians and opera singers.

Tickets are on sale now for this year's show, "Big Little Laws," which runs from Nov. 29 to Dec. 2 at DePaul University's Merle Reskin Theatre, 60 E. Balbo, Chicago.

Local and national politics will figure prominently in the show, with lawyers portraying outgoing Mayor Rahm Emanuel, upcoming Mayoral candidates, the recent national midterm

election winners, and U.S. Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

The Presidency of Donald Trump will be a major theme, along with appearances by cast members portraying Sarah Huckabee Sanders, Ivanka Trump and others.

"There was no shortage of material to draw upon for this year's show and we rewrite as news develops, so the show will be up to the minute when it comes to political breaking news," said Bar Show Producer Jeffrey Marks. "We are going to bring some hysterical performances and lyrics with a unique Chicago spin. And yes, we will be tweeting live throughout all of our performances."

Now in its 95th year, the Chicago Bar Association Bar Show is the longest running original musical revue in Chicago.

Tickets are \$45 for the main floor and \$35 for mezzanine. Group rates are available. All performances began at 7:30 p.m. except for Sunday which features a matinee performance at 2 p.m. Go to www.barshow.org for tickets or further information.

Norwood Park Author Stan "Tex" Banash Named **Illinois Bicentennial Honor 200 Honoree**

Chicago author and military veteran Stan "Tex" Banash was selected as an Illinois Bicentennial Honor 200 honoree and will be recognized at the December 3rd Bicentennial Celebration at the United Center, marking the date 200 years ago that Illinois became the 21st state in the nation. He is one of 200 honorees from more than 50 counties throughout Illinois.

Honorees are residents of Illinois, honorably discharged from the military, and were evaluated based on their achievements and contributions to their communities. Banash, who resides in Chicago's Norwood Park community, was nominated by State Rep. Michael P. McAuliffe (R-20th).

Announcing the honorees at a recent press conference in the Rotunda of the State Capitol, BG Stephen Curda (Ret.), Illinois Department of Veterans



Affairs director, said of the recipients: "Your time, energy, and contributions to your fellow veterans, service members, and local community, are recognized as going above and beyond the call of duty," adding that the celebration provides "an opportunity to showcase the value of community service, as demonstrated by our Illinois Veterans."

Banash served four years active duty in the U.S. Air Force (Strategic Air Command) and two years inactive Reserve, and is the author of Roadside History of Illinois (Mountain Press) and editor of Best of Dee Brown's West (Clear Light) and Dee Brown's Civil War Anthology (Clear Light). He has reviewed numerous books, and his most recent cover feature article, "Scars of Custer's Defeat," appeared in the June 2017 issue of Wild West magazine.

In his local community, he held various elected offices and committee chairmanships with the Edison Park Chamber of Commerce, including serving as its president for six years from 1988 -1994. Later he chaired the 41st Ward Zoning Advisory Board, established by former Ald. Brian Doherty, from 1993-2011. The board was the first of its kind in Chicago. He also served as sheriff of the Chicago Corral-The Westerners for five years from 1996-2001. He was raised in suburban Niles and graduated from Niles Township High School (East) in Skokie. Upon returning from military service, he obtained a Bachelor of Philosophy degree in political science from Northwestern University and a Master of Arts degree in Urban Studies from Roosevelt University. Since 1974, he has operated a home-based public relations business and, in 2004, established a Veterans Day recognition program at Norwood Crossing that is now in its 15th year. He is a member of American Legion Edison Park Post 541.

The Signature event at the United Center caps off a year of celebratory events around the state that highlighted Illinois' many achievements and illustrious history.

Feel the Holiday Spirit at Chicago's Traditional Christkindlmarket

The smell of fresh pretzels, bratwurst, and hot spiced wine (Glühwein), the sound of Christmas music, and the glimmer of sparkling Christmas ornaments, all in a cozy atmosphere this is the Christkindlmarket Chicago experience. From November 16 to December 24, 2018, visitors can enjoy the outdoor market with various vendors from Germany and around the world, watch performers, try out different foods and buy special gifts. Since 1996, German American Events, LLC, a subsidiary of the German American Chamber of Commerce of the Midwest, has hosted the Christkindlmarket Chicago as a free event, featuring nearly 60 vendors with unique offerings for all ages.

The youngest visitors have the opportunity to participate in the "Kinder Club". They will receive a free paper passport with coloring pages and learning games, in which they can collect stamps from different vendors on a scavenger hunt to win prizes. Other fun activities include the Lantern Parade on Kinder Tag when children get to march around and sing American and German Holiday songs with the Christkind, the namesake of the market. This fairy-like being, dressed in gold and white robes with a crown upon her golden locks, is the bearer of gifts to most children in Germanspeaking countries, much like Santa Claus is in the United States.



Guests may also enjoy a "Stammtisch" experience, a popular German tradition of a shared table gather, be it for a family, a business meeting, or a get-together with friends. Visitors can reserve a private table for up to eight people inside the heated Timber Haus where they can enjoy delicious food and drinks, such as sausages, potato pancakes, hot chocolate, and Glühwein.

This year, Christkindlmarket lovers do not only get the chance to experience the traditional markets in Chicago and Naperville, but also in Milwaukee. For the first time, the Christkindlmarket is taking place right next to Fiserv Forum where it will be open November 17 until December 31. All three markets offer

Taking a few moments to write a holiday card or send a pair of socks might seem like a small gesture, but for service members and veterans on the receiving end, such gifts can mean the world.

"We are proud to work with these partners to express our gratitude to the military and veteran communities this holiday season.'

In addition to cards, the Holiday Hero Drive includes sock donations this year. Participants can send in new tan or black boot socks to USO of Illinois officials, who will distribute the collected socks to deployed troops as well as veterans in Illinois Veterans' Homes.

Niles-Maine District Library Named Star Library 7 Years in a Row

Niles-Maine District Library has once again been named one of the nation's Star Libraries by the Library Journal, a publication specializing in research and reporting for public libraries. The rating is based on a massive review of data from over 7,000 libraries across the country, of which only 257 were chosen for the coveted title of Star Library.

Libraries' scores are determined by the specially-cultivated LJ Index, which mainly focuses on statistics for material circulation (including electronic materials such as e-books), program attendance, in-person visits, and public Internet usage. The index was designed to measure a library's total output of resources relative to peer libraries, with institutions being grouped based on yearly expenditure. Out of the hundreds of libraries evaluated for each group, the top 15 to 30 scorers are awarded Stars.

Having held the title of Star Library since 2012, Niles-Maine District Library is no stranger to the process. However, the continued recognition is nevertheless appreciated. "The Board and staff have worked hard to make the Niles-Maine District Library a jewel of the community," says Library Director Susan Lempke. "It's very exciting to see our efforts rewarded."

For the first time, Forest Preserves of Cook County picnic and special event permit sales for the upcoming year begins on Thursday, Nov. 15, 2018, nearly seven weeks earlier than the traditional January opening day.

"For years we have opened up reservations for the next year in person and online on the first working day after New Year's-usually Jan. 2. Every year people line up outside, sometimes when the temperature is below zero, to get their favorite groves for their preferred date. Additionally, we recognize that some residents may still be busy or out of town for the holidays come Jan. 2," explains Arnold Randall, General Superintendent for the Forest Preserves. "An earlier Opening Day helps alleviate some of these issues and also gives families more time to plan-some of our customers are planning weddings, family reunions and other important events and they want to celebrate those special moments in our Forest Preserves."

2019 offers numerous opportunities for Cook County residents to come together with family and friends. From birthdays and reunions to holidays and special event gatherings, the public can head to the Forest Preserves to plan their upcoming celebrations outside while surrounded by nature.

Online and in-person permit sales for 2019 picnics and special events begin at 8 a.m. on Thursday, Nov. 15. In-person sales will take place from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Forest Preserves of Cook County General Headquarters, 536 N. Harlem Ave. in River Forest, or at the Dan Ryan Visitor Center, 8700 S. Western Ave. in Chicago.

Online sales will also open at 8 a.m. on Nov. 15, and will remain available 24 hours a

day. In addition to saving time by purchasing permits online, visitors can view information such as site availability, grove maps and the various fees associated with grove rentals by visiting fpdcc.com/permits.

Those planning to apply for permits in person must have a valid state identification card or driver's license. Accepted payment methods are cash, check or credit card (Visa or MasterCard). Purchasers should begin completing their permit application immediately upon arrival to expedite wait time, and have two or three additional locations in mind in case the first choice is not available.

Regular hours at the General Headquarters location are Mondays through Fridays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Seasonal hours are Memorial Day through Labor Day, Mondays through Fridays 8:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. and Saturdays 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. at General Headquarters.

Picnic permits are required for groups of 25 or more. To reserve picnic groves and request event spaces either online or in-person, patrons must first set up an account at fpdcc. com/permits.

Permits for groups larger than 399 attendees may be requested beginning Oct. 15, 2018. Customers may submit applications in-person at the General Headquarters location, via email at fpd.permits@cookcountyil.gov or via fax at (708) 771-1071.

In 2018, more than 7,000 permits were sold for picnics and special events. Top sites for picnics and special events include Dan Ryan Woods in Chicago, Busse Woods in northwest Cook County, and Schiller Woods in Chicago/ Schiller Park.

Baked Cocktail Meatballs In Cranberry Sauce

The following recipe is from my good friend Eleanor who told me she recently served them at a family celebration. Everybody loved them ...

Ingredients for the meatballs:

2 lbs. ground meat (beef or turkey),

1 cup fine dry bread crumbs,

1 pkg. Lipton onion soup mix and 3 eggs.

Mix and shape into meatballs – small balls if you plan to serve them for cocktails or larger for a family meal. Bake on cookie sheet about

20 minutes at 325 to 350 degrees.

Ingredients for the sauce:

1 – 16 oz (500 ml) chili sauce (look for Bennettes available at the Jewel),

1 bottle of water, 1 cup light brown sugar, 1 cup drained sauerkraut and 1 can whole cranberry sauce (2 cup size).

Mix together and simmer for 20 minutes. Then put baked meatballs in a baking dish and pour sauce over all. Bake, uncovered, at 350 degrees for 1-1/2 to 2 hours. Set out toothpicks If serving with cocktails. If you plan to serve it as a main dish for your family or for guests, Eleanor suggests side dishes of mashed potatoes, zucchini or squash noodles, which are also available at the Jewel, or your choice of a vegetable.
