Friday, June 27 – Sunday, September 14 in the Spirit of Music Garden in Grant Park

The largest annual outdoor live music and dancing series in the United States, Chicago SummerDance, returns for its 18th year – and Chicagoans who love to dance will flock to the Spirit of Music Garden as it blossoms into a unique multi-dimensional, urban dance space. Chicago SummerDance is FREE and takes place in Grant Park's Spirit of Music Garden (601 South Michigan Avenue) Friday and Saturday evenings, from 6 to 9:30 p.m. and Sunday afternoons from 4 to 7 p.m. between June 27 and September 14.

The Spirit of Music Garden in Grant Park will also serve as a venue for World Music Festival Chicago 2014 on its opening weekend, September 12–14. These events will follow the Chicago SummerDance format with dance lessons and live music. World Music Festival Chicago 2014 runs Thursday, September 11 – Sunday, September 21. The complete schedule will be available at a later date at worldmusicfestivalchicago.org.

Presented by the Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events (DCASE), Chicago SummerDance brings people of all ages and skill levels together on a 4,900-square-foot, open-air dance floor made of 100% recycled plastic. The series offers FREE, introductory one-hour dance lessons by professional instructors followed by live music and dancing. The diverse lineup showcases various traditional and modern dance styles from all corners of the globe.

Chicagoans and visitors are also invited to enjoy SummerDance in the Parks at five different locations every Thursday, July 10 – September 4 beginning with dance lessons from 6-7 p.m. and live music and dancing from 7-9 p.m. SummerDance in the Parks is presented as part of an ongoing collaboration between the Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events and the Chicago Park District. Arts programming in neighborhoods advances the goals of the Chicago Cultural Plan and the Night Out in the Parks initiative. RTA Announces Ride Free Permit Expiration Date Extensions

Extensions Granted to Permits with June 30 and September 30 Expiration Dates

The Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) today announced that the expiration dates on the Ride Free Permits used by qualifying persons with disabilities and seniors will be extended to ensure there is no interruption in their use of transit.

Approximately 100,000 ers — 30,000 persons with disabilities and 70,000 seniors—currently use Ride Free permits with expiration dates of June 30 or September 30, 2014. The RTA is required by law to issue these permits to individuals who have been approved by the State of Illinois Benefit Access Program (BAP), formerly known as Circuit Breaker. The Persons with Disability Ride Free permits currently expire on June 30; these cards will now be useable until September 30, 2014. The Senior Ride Free permits that expire on September 30 will now be useable until November 30, 2014.

"As the issuing agency, the RTA recently became aware that many permit holders need additional time to apply for the BAP program. Due to the large number of riders applying, additional time is required in order to process the applications," said Leanne Redden, Acting Executive Director of the RTA. "To assure the remaining renewals are processed smoothly and that, most importantly, no qualified rider is unable to ride the transit system, we are extending the expiration dates of all of these permits by several months."

Because it may take up to 4-6

weeks for eligibility to be approved through BAP, riders should not delay in submitting their eligibility application through the State of Illinois Benefit Access Program. Any rider who does not have a new card on its expiration date will be granted an extension from that date. Riders do not need to take any action to receive this extension as the smart cards will automatically be updated.

There are two ways to confirm eligibility through BAP:

- 1. From any computer or mobile device, visit the Illinois Department of Aging Benefit Access Program website at www.illinois.gov/aging and click on the "Benefit Access" tab
- The State only allows applications online, not in writing or over the telephone
- The applicant must submit documentation online, which may require scanning documents to a computer to submit them online
- 2. If assistance is needed filling out the online form to confirm eligibility for the Illinois Benefit Access Program, an applicant may do one of the following:
- Call the Illinois Department on Aging at (800) 252-8966 to find a conveniently located center where staff can assist in filling the application or
- the City of Chicago's six Regional Senior Centers Monday through Friday, between 8:30 AM and 3:30PM. Riders can call 311 to find the closest Regional Senior Center.

New Trash Collection Boats

sioner Debra Shore, Chairman of Public Information and Education Committee of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater

Chicago, has announced that the District is adding two trash collection boats to its fleet in honor of its 125th Anniversary, and the Public is invited to help name them.

The two new skimmer boats will operate along the Chicago Area Waterways (CAWS) from mid-April to mid-October and after significant storms year round, unless weather

C o m m i s - conditions prohibit safe operations. Currently the MWRD operates two 28-foot pontoons to collect floatables that wind up in the CAWS during rainstorms. Workers remove debris along the South Branch to the North Branch of the Chicago River.

Commissioner Shore stated, "The Chicago Area Waterways are a vital amenity for people in Cook County. These new debris collection boats will improve water quality and recreational experience for thousands of people canoeing, kayaking, boating and enjoying the waterways".

But these aren't the only interesting gals that will be in town this summer. As we put Megon into the calendar, I realized how many remarkable women we have


Don't Let Summer Pass You By

On July 25, Ester Hana, 'Lady T' Marcelain and Yoko Noge team up for Chicago Women in Blues, Jazz and Popular Song. Don't let this unassuming title disguise what a gem this is. These women are all international sensations who have brought their talents to the states and the Chicago area.

Yoko Noge settled in Chicago in the 80's but still performs annually in Japan. Her music style is a fusion of American jazz and blues, mixed with Japanese folk and traditional music. Her original compositions find a commonality between Africanrooted music and the music of Japan.


'Lady T' returned to Chicago in the late 1990s, after living and working in Europe, East-West-and-South Africa, Latin America and the former Soviet Union. She's known as "the American lady with a lot of jazz to give." She was the manager of a jazz club in Ghana, and originated the very first Jazz Festival in Zambia. She has also been promoting "Jazz Appreciation Month" on behalf of the Smithsonian Institution since the observance began in 2002. Lady T's performances are a mellow and intimate blend of music from the hottest years of America's vocal jazz, with some African and European influences.

Ester Hana is from Dalaguete, Cebu in central Philippines, and is an internationally known singer and pianist. Ester's musical career brought her to Chicago, after successful performances in Manila and Bangkok. She is a phenomenal talent, whose performances are a mixture of ethnic and popular music, in over a dozen languages, embodying her Filipino roots. She is amazingly versatile. Ester is also appearing with Carla Gordon, Jan Slavin and the Americana Ensemble of the Old Town School of Folk Music in Give a Hootenanny, a folk music sing-a-long for the entire family on July 20.

Let's not forget Caryn Bark and the Funny Old Broads. She's been seen nationally on Catch a Rising Star and Lifetime's Girl's Night Out, but the star of Diary of a Skokie Girl is still a local girl at heart, and bring the Funny Old Broads home on Thursday nights for six weeks starting July 10.

12th Annual After Supper Visions Exhibit Raises \$10,000 for Catholic Charities Supper Guests

Program gives a voice and vision to those who are homeless or at risk of homelessness; Exhibit featured 60 artists

The 12th Annual Catholic Charities After Supper Visions photography exhibit on June 6 and 7 raised more than \$10,000 to support the photography artists. The photographers who displayed their artwork can't be found in the pages of magazines or on the walls of art museums – they are not professionals. They are guests of the Catholic Charities supper program. Many of the photographers are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Most had never picked up a camera before, but their photographs provide an opportunity to see Chicago from a different point of view – their point of view.

The annual exhibit, set up like an art gallery at Catholic Charities headquarters in the River North neighborhood, was just one opportunity the public had to support the artists and see photography unlike any other in Chicago. Prints and notecards are always available for purchase on the program's website at www.aftersuppervisions.com. The artists use the profits to help with security deposits for apartments, paying utility bills, buying food or purchasing digital cameras to encourage their new passion.

"Catholic Charities and this program have given me a purpose and I am grateful for that," said Amie Davis, an artist and participant in the After Supper Visions program. "I want people to remember that when they buy a print from us they aren't just buying a nice photo, they may be helping someone pay a bill or buy food or take care of themselves. It is more than just artwork."

The After Supper Visions program was founded 12 years ago by staff at Catholic Charities and volunteers who served dinner to the guests at the Tuesday evening supper program. Supper guests are given a disposable camera and encouraged to photograph the city from their point of view. Volunteers develop the photographs and the artists choose the best three to four photos to display at the exhibit.

"We want to give our supper guests an opportunity to share their perspective," said Monsignor Michael M. Boland, President of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago. "The After Supper Visions program has given more than 200 artists an opportunity to express themselves through photography. To date more than 23,000 photos have been taken, and \$110,000 has been raised to help our guests become more self-sufficient."

Local High School Student Could Win A Trip To Washington, D.C. And A \$30,000 Scholarship

Commander John Davin of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Department of Illinois today announced the kick-off of the 68th year of the VFW and its Ladies Auxiliary Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition. Local high school students have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students begin by competing at the local Post level with a deadline of Nov 1, 2014. Post winners advance to District and then the first place District winner advances to the state competition. All state winners receive a four day trip to Washington, D.C. A total of \$152,000 is awarded to national finalists. First place is a \$30,000 college scholarship.

Annually the VFW provides more than \$2 million in scholarships. Each year, around 40,000 students participate in the competition.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on this theme for 2014-2015: "Why Veterans are Important to our Nation's History and Future" on an audio cassette tape or audio CD and present their recording, typed essay, and entry form at their local VFW Post by November 1, 2014.

Village Cooking Corner

From the Kitchen of Anastasia E. Weaver

This is one of my favorite go to recipes for summer eating whether I am entertaining a small group or having dinner with my husband. It is a side dish whether the main course is vegetarian, chicken, fish or hamburgers on the grill This is a great potato salad for a picnic side also. It is delicious served warm or cold or the next day.

Greek Potato Salad

- 4 Large Potatoes I usually use Russet but Yukon Gold work well also 1 small onion in circles – my preference is Vidalia Sweet Onions or a Red Onion (both work well)
- 4 green onions washed and chopped in small pieces
- 2 tsps Fresh Parsley

For the Dressing

1/3 cup of Olive Oil1/3 cup Juice of Lemon1tbsp of Dried and crushed OreganoSalt and Pepper to taste

This is a serving for 4 and the approximate preparation and cooking time is about 45 minutes. Wash the potatoes well and boil in enough water to cover the potatoes.. Cook until softened. You will want to check periodically to make sure they are soft but not melted down. Drain the potatoes and permit to cool so that they will be easily handled while peeling them. Cut the potatoes in small cubes and place in a bowl Combine the onion as well as the green onion and the parsley with the potatoes. Note: you may substitute fresh dill or fresh mint for the parsley, depending on your preference. I often substitute dill for parsley. Beat the dressing ingredients together and mix gently into the potato/onion mixture. Permit to sit for an hour or two prior to serving so that the seasonings permeate the potatoes. Serve on a platter or in a bowl.
