Divvy Bikes To Compete In 2014 Transamerica Chicago Triathlon 100 Participants will Ride a Divvy Bike in the Transamerica Chicago Triathlon SuperSprint Event

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced today that the 2014 Transamerica Chicago Triathlon will include the "Divvy Wave". at the Transamerica Chicago Triathlon SuperSprint event this summer in an effort to encourage individuals of all experience levels, including those new to the sport of triathlon, to participate in the August event along the lakefront.

The SuperSprint event, presented by Toyota and Life Time – The Healthy Way of Life Company, will be held on Saturday, August 23rd at Montrose Beach. Life Time will offer 100 entries to the Divvy Wave, which will include complimentary use of Divvy bikes for the 10K SuperSprint bike course. Participants will also swim 375 meters and run 2.5 kilometers as part of the SuperSprint Tri event, and will be competing against each other for unique Divvy prizes.

"Divvy isn't just a convenient and fast way to get around the city, it's also fun and good for you," Mayor Emanuel said. "This new Divvy Wave will allow people to try out the sport of triathlon, and compete with one another in fun way."

Beyond use of the bike, all Divvy Wave participants will receive a special triathlon training kit that includes: an eight-week training program; coaching support from Life Time Tri certified coaches; inclusion into the Transamerica Chicago Triathlon's Open Water Swim Clinic Series and community events: complimentary 24-hour Divvy pass; gift certificate for \$10 off Divvy annual membership; and race weekend swag bags with Transamerica Chicago Triathlon goodies.

'We're excited to introduce the new Divvy Wave and break down the barriers to entry that triathlons normally face," says Scott Hutmacher, Transamerica Chicago Triathlon Regional Marketing Manager. "Equipment, including tri bikes, can be expensive, especially for first time triathletes who are not quite ready to make such significant investments. With Divvy bikes, people can 'try a tri', and have a lot of fun doing it."

We start with the Broadway smash Sweet Charity from September 12 - 28. Join the dance hall girl with the heart of gold as she searches for true love amongst the zany characters of New York. Last Call for Village of Skokie Vehicle **Stickers and Pet Licenses!**

Village of Skokie vehicle stickers are available now and must be displayed on windshields by August 31. The stickers are available for purchase online at www.skokie.org and at Village Hall, 5127 Oakton Street.

All vehicles registered with the State of Illinois to an address within the corporate limits of the Village of Skokie must display a valid Village sticker. The address appearing in the Secretary of State's records for the vehicle is the criterion and the owner of record is responsible for obtaining the sticker.

Passenger vehicle stickers purchased through August 31 cost \$30. After that date, the cost increases to be presented at the time of purchase \$45. Other vehicles have different licensing fees. Vehicle sticker renewals may be made online at www. skokie.org through August 31. Payment is accepted from Visa, Master-Card, Discover and debit cards. The Village does not charge an added fee for paying with a credit card.

able at Village Hall, 5127 Oakton Street. Proof of Zone residency and purchase of current Skokie vehicle sticker is required to obtain a permit. The annual permit fee is \$2 per permit.

Pet licenses also are available at Village Hall. With a veterinarian's statement of spay/neutering, the 2014 pet license fee is \$10. Without the statement the fee is \$25. For any animal declared dangerous the cost is \$150. For any animal declared vicious the cost is \$250. For a citizen to receive an Individual Breeder License, the cost is \$250.

A current rabies certificate must whether purchasing in-person or by mail. Pet licenses cannot be renewed online at this time. Vehicle stickers and pet licenses can be purchased at Skokie Village Hall, 5127 Oakton Street, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Our discussions, planning and organizing began in the midst of the most horrific winter I can remember. Just think of any party of 4 to 24 you have planned at home for a birthday, anniversary or holiday celebration. The hours of planning, shopping, cleaning and cooking and then being there for your guests. So the Festival chairs Zach Bazianos, Dr. John Laftsidis, Chris Tsiones and I Anastasia Weaver start communicating, planning, and organizing all the activities of this major fund raiser and celebration of our church's anniversary St. Demetrios Chicago's Greek Fest months in advance of August. Each of us has taken on certain responsibilities but each of us frequently communicates with the team to synchronize our activities and stay on board so on the target date in August all the pieces are in place as the doors of our Festival open and we are ready to welcome our guests. We have inherited a passion for food, a passion for family and friends, a passion for good music and certainly

a passion and commitment to our church. Although the work of putting together this Great Big Party is labor intensive, it is often filled with much fun and great memories. Our cadre of enthusiastic volunteers from all professions and walks of life and all age groups are ready and excited about welcoming all of you. We extend a cordial and warm invitation to all. Bring your family, friends, and neighbors and join us in celebrating our parish's 86th Anniversary in this community with our **65th CHICAGO'S GREEKFEST on August 15**, **16**, **17**.

OUR HISTORY

In order to understand who we are and how we got here at 2727 West Winona in Chicago's Lincoln Square we want to share our history with you. St. Demetrios is located at 2727 West Winona Street in Chicago's Lincoln Square almost at the far northwest corner of the city as one embarks into Lincolnwood, Evanston and Skokie. We are nestled next to Swedish Covenant Hospital on a quiet residential street where St. Demetrios Church got its start in 1927. A small group of parish council members of the Annunciation Cathedral at 1017 N. La Salle Street, who were responsible for directing the affairs and destiny of one of the oldest Greek Orthodox church communities in Chicago, conceived the idea of a church school and chapel closer to their homes on the far north side of Chicago where the church now stands on Winona. This was a dream that took fruition and became a reality with the purchase of a property bounded by Carmen Avenue

on the South, Washtenaw on the West and Winona Street on the North. They planned a school and chapel and in spite of the then difficult economic times it became a reality when they built the building on the property where our church now stands.

History somehow repeats itself every so often, as we all well know. During all the planning of this great edifice was taking place, the country was in the midst of the Great Depression years of the early 1930's but the spirit of these early founders was undaunted. They worked hard, using their own funds to support their idea of a School and Chapel on this property. At times, they had to sacrifice not only their own money but put in a great deal of personal labor carrying coal and doing many other tasks to maintain and support the building they had so lovingly built. On the corner of Carmen and Washtenaw still stands a beautiful two unit yellow brick building that was once the home of the two families that were part of the original parish council that envisioned the dream for the property on which St. Demetrios stands. They were some of the same people who loved this church so much they would be seen walking from their home with a small wagon carrying the coal that would be used to heat the building. This group established the Solon Greek School in 1928 which still exists and gives young people Greek language education and an opportunity to enhance their educational backgrounds as citizens of this country. In 1937 the Religious Education

Program was begun at St. Demetrios and still flourishes today. In 1940 when the Depression years were finally put behind them, the Annunciation Cathedral and St. Demetrios Church reorganized under one community and became the United Greek Orthodox Churches of Chicago. In 1982, the membership of the United Community, in a special assembly, voted unanimously to dissolve, the United Greek Orthodox church and to allow Annunciation (the mother church) and St. Demetrios (the fledgling) to function as independent churches as is customary in the Metropolis. The historic decision took effect on January 1, 1983. During the 1980's and the 1990's many physical improvements wer



1980's and the 1990's many physical improvements were made to the original structure namely, the Byzantine Iconography in the church interior, the enlarged Narthex as you enter the church of St. Demetrios, the enclosed from staircase wit its magnificent stained glass windows and the addition of an elevator, which has significantly enhanced the ability for elderly or handicapped parishioners and guests to access the church proper. Like any living entity, St. Demetrios is continuously striving to improve its structure and its services to its parishioners and the community. Since the mid-1990's into the present decade, St. Demetrios Church under the spiritual guidance and leadership of our Priest, Father Apostolos N. Georgiafentis we continue to make improvements to the aging structure and bring more of the Orthodox Iconography into the interior and establishing many spiritually enriching programs and activities for the parishioners and the children of the community. The parish council following in the footsteps of the original founders continues to strive to find ways to assist the parish clergy in funding the many improvements required in any aging structure. The mission has not changed. The St. Demetrios community being a living entity continues to grow in spirit and in beauty. It continues to serve faithfully the thousands who enter the doors every year and to provide the sacraments to its faithful as a part of the Metropolis of Chicago, which comprises six Midwestern states: Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Indiana, Missouri and Illinois, under the spiritual guidance of His Eminence Metropolitan Iakovos and Bishop Demetrios of Mokissos. We all recognize that our nation is still in difficult economic times that has affected many of our

own faithful and community and has delayed in fact some of our dreams for improving our church facility for the time being. One thing is for sure, the spirit of our founders back in 1927 still runs deep in our community and everyone clergy, parish council members, church staff, parishioners young and not-so-young, friends of St. Demetrios and everyone surrounding this large family of St. Demetrios is pitching in to help whether it is with monetary donations or volunteering to serve in whatever is needed... and the love within this community is still shining ever so brightly onto the path of our future generations. We welcome you with open arms to our Festival 2014 and thank you in advance for sharing in our proud heritage and look forward to offering all our hospitality on August 15, 16, and 17.

Note: You may also be interested to know that our Patron Saint is St. Demetrios of Thessaloniki - also known as Salonika; a port city in the northern Macedonian region of Greece. In the "Myrovlitis" book store of our St. Demetrios Church you will find a book entitled "O God of Demetrios" which tells the story of St. Demetrios a Saint revered by our church and our faithful. He is our inspiration for he had everything young people seek today -education, wealth, position, respect, athletic abilities, good looks, strength, popularity but most of all he was courageous, committed to the Lord and faithful.

TRADITIONAL GREEK RECIPES

ROAST LEG OF LAMB

Leg of Lamb has to be my very favorite of the red meats. It is served in different ways for different occasions. For a general small family or friends gathering, purchase a leg of lamb weighing about 5 to 6 pounds. When I serve it for Easter (Pascha) dinner or larger family gatherings of 12 or more, I purchase a leg of lamb weighing about 10 pounds. From my experience, I always make sure that I purchase USA lamb from Colorado as opposed to imported lamb. I like the taste much better. *Serves Six:*

Leg of Lamb 5 to 6 pounds
 Salt and pepper
 5 garlic cloves, slivered.
 1 or 2 tablespoons of Oregano
 1 teaspoon of thyme
 juice of 1 lemon
 1/2 cup of olive oil
 White Wine
 1/2 cup melted unsalted butter
 Potatoes - I use about 7 or 8 Yukon Gold Potatoes



put in the roasting pan and turn the potatoes to make sure they brown on all sides. Complete your meal with zucchini or green beans sauteed with onions in tomato sauce, a Greek salad of tomatoes, onions, cucumbers, feta cheese and Kalamata olives and sprinkle with oregano and a dressing of extra virgin olive oil and red wine vinegar. Of course, if it is available to you, leg of lamb is absolutely delicious when roasted on a spit over charcoal. You may also ask your butcher to have the leg of lamb boned and rolled, it is easier to slice and handle after roasting in the oven. *KALI OREXI! (Bon Appetit) Enjoy!*

SHRIMP (GARIDES) WITH TOMATOES AND FETA

2 Lbs. Medium Shrimp 2 to 3 Ripe Tomatoes, finely diced

Wash and pat dry the leg of lamb and place in a roasting pan. Sliver the garlic. There are two methods of using the garlic with the lamb. You can rub crushed garlic onto the entire leg of lamb or make small slits with a knife and insert the slivered pieces of garlic into the lamb. I usually insert the slivered pieces of garlic in the leg of lamb. Mix the oregano and thyme and rub over all sides of the of lamb. In a bowl or mixing cup mix the juice from 1 lemon, the wine and the olive oil and pour over the lamb making sure the lamb is completely covered.

Cover with foil wrap and place in the refrigerator to marinate the lamb for several hours. Roast lamb at 350 degrees for about 1-1/2 hours if you like pink meat and about 2 hours if you prefer well done. Most Greeks prefer the well done meat.

While roasting baste frequently with a mixture of 1/2cup white wine and the melted butter and pour some hot water(about 1 cup) into the pan. An hour before the roast is done peal and cut each potato into four lengthwise pieces and surround the lamb with the potatoes. Sprinkle the potatoes with pepper, oregano and a little salt as well as lemon juice. Continue to baste after the potatoes have been

1- 1/2 cups of Olive Oil
2 onions, finely diced (I prefer Georgia Vidalia Onions
2 cloves of Garlic finely chopped
7 oz. Feta Cheese
2 tsp. Sugar
1 Bay Leaf
Sea Salt and Freshly Ground Pepper to taste



In a frying pan, sauté the onions and garlic in the olive oil for a few minutes. Do not permit the garlic to burn. Add diced tomatoes, bay leaf, sugar, salt and pepper and an adequate amount of water. Cook the sauce for about 30 minutes. Drop the cleaned shrimp into the sauce and continue cooking for another 4 minutes. Remove from heat. Place both shrimp and sauce in a baking dish and spread thin slices of Feta Cheese over the shrimp.

Bake in 350 degree preheated oven for about 10 minutes.

Serve over rice accompanied by a Baby Greens Salad with Kalamata Olives and a dressing of olive oil, red wine vinegar, oregano, salt and pepper to taste. *Enjoy!*

Trustee: an Honor and a Responsibility

You are named as Successor Trustee in your parent's, siblings, or other loved one's Trust. This is an honor and a responsibility. Of course, it is an honor because they have chosen you to carry out the wishes closest to their heart. It is a responsibility because the actions you make can have serious legal and tax consequences.

As Successor Trustee, when the initial Trustee (usually the "grantor" or owner of the Trust) dies, you become Trustee. As Trustee, it is your responsibility to administer the Trust. In other words, you must gather all the assets, manage them, and distribute them according to its terms.

In doing so, you have many decisions to make. When will you make distributions to subtrusts or beneficiaries? Are any estate taxes owed? Are any income taxes owed by the Trust grantor or the Trust itself? If the Trust directs you to create subtrusts, which assets should you put in which subtrust? What valuation date do you use, the date the grantor died or the date you are funding the subtrust? These choices could have income and estate tax consequences for the beneficiaries of the Trust for years to come.

Answers to some of these questions may seem deceptively simple. For example, how should you invest the assets? Depending on the terms of the trust and state law, you may have different duties. Let's say you simply leave the assets the way they were invested before the initial Trustee died. This may not be prudent, especially in a down market, and you may be held responsible for losses the Trust and its beneficiaries suffer as a result.

The answer to each of these questions varies depending upon the unique circumstances of your case and state and federal law. While it is typically easier and less expensive to administer a Trust than to administer a probate estate under a Will, you need professional advice to complete the Trust administration process. Consulting a qualified estate planning attorney helps prevent errors in Trust administration--errors which would have cost the Trust and its beneficiaries in increased taxes and forgone opportunities.

Take a couple weeks to grieve. But, then act quickly. There are deadlines for tax and other filings and the clock is ticking.




