# **CPS Looks to Expert Logistics Management Firm to Lead Move of Underutilized Schools**

Firm Will Move Furniture, Equipment, Records and Other Items to Welcoming Schools so CPS Can Keep Its Focus on Children; Firm Will Hire From Within Communities to Manage Move to Welcoming Schools

CHICAGO – As part of a competitive bidding process, Chicago Public Schools (CPS) is recommending to award a national firm with extensive local experience to lead the work needed to move furniture, records, equipment, technology, supplies, instructional materials and other items from underutilized schools that will be consolidated this fall. These resources will follow students to their welcoming school as part of the District's overall investments to provide all children at welcoming schools with a quality, 21st century education.

Pending approval from the Chicago Board of Education (BOE) at its monthly meeting today, Global Workplace Solutions (GWS) would be responsible for conducting a school by school asset management analysis immediately in order to be prepared well in advance for the full scale of the work that will be required for these moves, which is ultimately dependent on which underutilized schools are approved for consolidation by the BOE in May.

GWS will work with and hire community members and students from the sending and welcoming school communities to assist with inventory and moving, which will offer opportunities to learn hands-on logistics management skills.

"Partnering with an experienced logistics management firm will allow experts in this field to lead this work, and allow CPS to focus on its students throughout this process and expand its capacity to safely and seamlessly transition them to welcoming schools this fall," said CPS CEO Barbara Byrd-Bennett.

GWS submitted a bid for this work as part of a Request For Proposals (RFP) that was issued in March. There were four responses in total, with two qualifying as responsive to the RFP. GWS's proposal came in 25 percent less in cost compared with the second qualifying respondent. The contract will allow for spending up to \$14.2 million. Strategic Facilities Solutions and Corporate Facilities Solutions are also included as sub-contractors who will be responsible for other aspects of this work. They are each a Minority- and Women-owned Business (M/WBE) firm, respectively.

Chicago Public Schools serves 403,000 students in 681 schools. It is the nation's third-largest school district.

# Historical Society Hosts Presentation About The Chicago "L," Chicago's Biggest "Mover and Shaker"

A presentation about Chicago's mass transit rail line will be held at the Norwood Park Historical Society on April 24 at 7 p.m. All are welcome to attend for free.

The Norwood Park Historical Society will welcome Greg Borzo, author of The Chicago "L," on April 24 at 7 p.m. This presentation—held at Chicago's oldest home, the Noble-Seymour-Crippen House—is free and open to the public. Discover the world-famous Chicago "L" in all its grit and glory with Borzo as he gives a presentation portraying the growth and development of the "L." The "L" has been running 24/7 for 121 years. See how it came to be and why it needs to be preserved. The presentation will be lavishly illustrated with almost 100 images. Mass transit never looked so good!

Born in Chicago, Borzo is active in many of the city's cultural, historical, tourguide, bicycle and writing circles. Borzo has a bachelor's degree from Grinnell College and a master's degree in journalism from Northwestern University. He has been a reporter, editor and/or writer at Modern Railroads Magazine, Traffic World, American Medical Association, Field Museum and University of Chicago. Borzo is the author of three books about Chicago; The Chicago "L" (Arcadia Publishing, 2007), a history of Chicago's greatest working antique and biggest "mover and shaker"; Where to Bike Chicago: Best Biking in City and Suburbs (BA Press, 2011), which describes, rates, photographs and maps the 72 best bike rides around Chicagoland; and Chicago Cable Cars (The History Press 2012), which tells the incredible forgotten story of a time when Chicago had the largest cable car system the world has ever seen.

Borzo lives in the South Loop and conducts tours about Chicago history, the "L" and cable cars for the Chicago History Museum, Chicago Cycling Club, Forgotten Chicago and others—by bike, on the "L" and on foot. This free program is appropriate for adults and children; donations are welcome.

# City Council Licensing Committee Unanimously Approves Ordinance Authorizing Year-Round City Vehicle Sticker Sales

Clerk Susana Mendoza working to educate public for changes coming in 2014

CHICAGO, IL (April 3, 2013) – The first major overhaul of the City's Vehicle Sticker program in more than 100 years was unanimously approved by the City Council Committee on License and Consumer Protection today.

City Clerk Susana A. Mendoza championed a transition from seasonal to Year-Round City Vehicle Sticker Sales since before taking office.

"The goal is to improve the customer service experience, reduce wait times and overtime costs, allow customers to better budget for vehicle costs and bring greater efficiencies to the City Clerk's Office. The approval of the Year-Round Sales ordinance at the committee level is another step in the process of changing an antiquated system. Our focus now is educating the public about the changes that will be coming in 2014," Clerk Mendoza said.

Clerk Mendoza said seasonal sales is an outmoded system and its time has passed. "The system hasn't changed fundamentally since the era of the horse and buggy. When I took office, I was told we processed more than one million transactions during a six-week period each summer because 'that's how we've always done it.' That's not acceptable and now we're taking bold steps to make the renewal process better for residents and more efficient for the City of Chicago," she said.

The 2013 City Vehicle Sticker season will be the last time residents receive a June-to-June sticker renewal. When drivers renew their stickers in June 2014, they will be assigned a new expiration date. The new expiration date will be 6 months apart from the expiration of their Illinois license plate sticker.

By staggering the expiration of the city sticker from the license plate sticker, Chicagoans will be better able to budget for their vehicle expenses, Mendoza said.

In 2013, the Clerk's Office will require residents to bring their renewal forms when purchasing new stickers in person. The renewals will include VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) data which is a critical piece of data for the transition.

"Technology infrastructure improvements are a major aspect of the transition and VIN data will help us set the new Year-Round Sales renewal date that will take effect in 2014-2015," Mendoza said.

Seniors over the age of 65 will not be affected by Year-Round Sales and will remain on a June-to-June schedule.

Since 1908, City Vehicle Stickers have been purchased during a short, seasonal window. Last summer, the City Clerk's Office completed more than one million transactions during the seasonal rush. Each year the Office generates about \$115 million in revenue.

Costs for City Vehicle Stickers remain unchanged this year, with passenger vehicles stickers costing \$85 and large passenger vehicle stickers costing \$135.





# After the Divorce: The Work's Not Over Yet

Unfortunately, it's common knowledge that divorce is on the rise in America. The statistics are astonishing, and it must be acknowledged as a possible reality for anyone contemplating or currently in a marriage. If it does occur, surviving the actual divorce process may seem difficult enough, but the hard work associated with returning your life to some semblance of normalcy doesn't end there. Divorce also affects your estate plan.

### **Fiduciary Designations**

After the divorce is final, and possibly even before, a review of all estate planning documents is necessary. It is particularly important to review fiduciary designa-

tions with the following questions in mind:

- Who is designated as the Trustee of a Trust?
- Who is designated as the Executor/Personal Representative of a Will?
- Who is designated as Agent under a Property Power of Attorney, Health Care Power of Attorney, or Health Care Proxy?

Quite often, the person designated under all these documents is a spouse. Therefore, if the designations are not changed, the ex-spouse will continue to act in such a capacity. Of course, this can result in a highly unintended outcome, and can cause extreme turmoil, particularly where a new spouse has entered the picture!

### **Beneficiary Designations**

In addition to reviewing fiduciary designations, it is necessary to review beneficiary designations. This includes retirement accounts such as IRAs, and estate planning documents such as Revocable Living Trusts. Determine whether an exspouse or family member of the ex-spouse is still the intended beneficiary.

### **Joint Tenancy Assets**

Ascertain whether assets are held in Joint Tenancy with the ex-spouse or a family member of the ex-spouse. If death occurs before the divorce is final, the entire joint tenancy asset will pass to the remaining joint tenant through the survivorship feature of Joint Tenancy.

### \*Caution\*

Impulsive changes must be avoided at all costs. To begin with, a hasty asset transfer could violate the applicable Uniform Fraudulent Transfer Act or the Uniform Fraudulent Conveyance Act, as well as state marital or community property laws. Additionally, it is necessary to be sure to comply with the terms of the divorce decree. In general, a divorce decree takes priority over differing provisions in an estate plan.

Divorce is usually a difficult and emotional time. But it is imperative to find the strength to fully arrange your financial affairs. Before any action is taken, it is important to consult with a qualified estate planning attorney. Failure to do so could result in a detrimental outcome. Inaction could result in unintended asset transfers, while premature action could lead to fraudulent transfer penalties. However, with the guidance of a knowledgeable estate planning attorney, organizing an estate plan can bring you a step closer to finality.

# **Urban Wildlife**Be Kind to our Fine-Feathered Friends

Springtime is migration season for millions of birds, and Chicago is a favorite stopping ground en route back to northerly homes. The route many follow is known as the Mississippi Flyway, beginning in Mississippi River Valley and extending all the way to northwest Canada, passing through the Great Lakes on the way. It's an amazing time to watch birds – more than 250 species usually fly through Chicago skies in April and May, but it is also a dangerous time for our avian friends.

Each year thousands of birds collide with city windows, where they fall to the ground stunned and unconscious. With timely treatment, more than 80% of these injured birds can be saved and released back to the wild. Urban Wildlife Coalition works closely with Flint Creek Wildlife Rehabilitation, a state- and federally-licensed facility dedicated to rehabilitating injured and orphaned wildlife.

Volunteers are urgently needed during the upcoming spring migration (begins around March 15). A few hours one morning a week can save hundreds of avian lives. Training is provided. For more information, please visit www.flintcreek-wildlife.org/volunteer.htm or phone 847-842-8000.

In the meantime, be prepared in case you find an injured or orphaned bird: Keep a box or bag in your car, along with paper towels or small rags.

Enter the Flint Creek Wildlife hotline number in your cell phone, just in case. Place the bird in a paper bag with a folded paper towel at the bottom. Secure the bag with a clip.

Place the bag in a dark, quiet location and phone the number above.

Human instinct almost always is to give food and water to an injured animal or to try to give medical assistance. Resist the temptation. It can cause further injury more often than not.

Injured birds can be dropped off at Flint Creek's Northerly Island facility daily between 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. (visit www.flintcreekwildlife.org for directions).

# Isabel Wilkerson's "The Warmth of Other Suns" to be the 2013 selection

Mayor Rahm Emanuel today joined Chicago Public Library Commissioner Brian Bannon and Library Board President Linda Johnson Rice in announcing a major expansion of the Library's One Book, One Chicago program and the choice of Isabel Wilkerson's The Warmth of Other Suns: The Epic Story of America's Great Migration as the next selection in the Library's nationally recognized, award-winning, citywide book club.

"Isabel Wilkerson's book brings to life the stories of African Americans who left their homes in the South in search of a better life. These are the stories of people who helped create the Chicago we know today – and of people continuing to come to our city each day in hopes of finding their dream," said Mayor Emanuel. "Each of us has a story to tell about our family's path to Chicago and how we all helped to make Chicago the most American of American cities."

The Library will now host a year-long discussion of one book and its ideas, an expansion from the month-long programs offered twice a year since the series started 12 years ago.

Beginning this April and continuing into spring 2014, the Chicago Public Library and its many community partners will host a series of events each month, all exploring the theme of migration and how it has shaped – and continues to shape – Chicago.

"The themes contained in this book inspired us to expand the One Book, One Chicago program to 12 full months of programs and conversations," Commissioner Bannon added. "The ideas and discussions they spark are simply too big to be contained in a single month. We look forward to engaging with all Chicagoans to hear their story, to hear how they helped to create the tapestry of our city."

The One Book, One Chicago program, which has been replicated in more than 150 cities across the country, is made possible by Allstate and BMO Harris, through the Chicago Public Library Foundation. Thanks to pro bono efforts of Leo Burnett the new One Book, One Chicago program now hosts a new logo and campaign inviting Chicagoans to join the conversation.

The Library is joining with many community partners to bring Chicagoans a variety of ways to participate each month. Through events in neighborhood libraries, at the downtown Harold Washington Library Center and at partner locations, people can take part in art exhibits, story-telling, panel discussions, music performances, and of course, book discussions.

In April, WBEZ and the Center for Civic Reflection will hold three community discussions based on Richard Wright's Black Boy, in which he describes his migration to Chicago. These discussions will explore Chicago's history as a gateway for such hopeful migrants from the 20th century to today, with a community conversation that starts with Wright's words about seeking "the warmth of other suns" and asks if those who sought out Chicago during the Great Migration found what they were looking for.

In May, Chicago historian and recent Champion of Freedom Award recipient Timuel Black will join Johnson Publishing President & CEO Linda Johnson Rice and historian Adam Green at the Harold Washington Library for a discussion across generations of how the Great Migration shaped the city and their lives.

Chicago's Department of Cultural Affairs & Special Events will offer performances by Blues musicians at branch libraries, in advance of the 30th Annual Chicago Blues Festival this June which this year is themed "Rollin' Up the River," celebrating the evolution of the blues from South to North up the Mississippi.

From May through October, StoryCorps, a national nonprofit oral history project which aims to create a portrait of who we are as Americans, will visit 13 CPL locations each month to offer Chicagoans opportunities to tell their migration story. StoryCorps@ your library is made possible by a grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) to the American Library Association (ALA) Public Programs Office.

On October 1, author Isabel Wilkerson will appear at the Harold Washington Library Center to read from and discuss her book, which is the centerpiece of the newly designed One Book, One Chicago program.

Partners in this year's One Book, One Chicago include The Art Institute of Chicago, Center for Civic Reflections, Congo Square Theatre Company, Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events, Chicago Office of New Americans, DePaul University, DuSable Museum of African American History, Little Black Pearl, StoryCorps@ your library, and the Third Coast International Audio Festival.

Throughout its 139-year history, the Chicago Public Library has always encouraged Chicagoans of all ages to make reading a priority. One Book, One Chicago began in the fall of 2001, to encourage all Chicagoans to read the same book at the time, bringing our diverse city together around one great book.
