

Veterans, residents, friends, and families are invited to gather for a special Veterans Day Commemorative Program, on Thurs., Nov. 10, at 10:00 a.m., at Norwood Crossing, 6016-20 N. Nina Ave. in Chicago. Parking is available on the street or in the parking lot behind the building (entrance off Avondale Avenue).

VETERANS DAY REMINDER: MILITARY SERVICE AND SOCIAL SECURITY

Each year, on November 11, America observes Veterans Day and honors the men and women who have served in our nation's Armed Forces. Many of our Vietnam era veterans are now nearing retirement age, or already there. It is important that they - and other American service personnel - know just what retirement benefits they can count on from Social Security as they make their future financial plans.

Like most of the civilian workforce, all current military personnel pay Social Security taxes and earn Social Security coverage. Earnings for active duty military service or active duty training have been covered under Social Security since 1957. Also, earnings for inactive duty service in the reserves (such as weekend drills) have had Social Security coverage since 1988.

In addition to regular military pay, Social Security adds special earnings credits to an individual's Social Security record when he or she serves in the military. The extra earnings are for periods of active duty or active duty training. If, for example, a person served in the military between 1957 and 1977, he or she has been credited with \$300 in additional earnings for each calendar quarter in which active duty basic pay was earned. These extra earnings may help someone qualify for Social Security or increase the amount of the Social Security benefit.

The number of credits an individual needs to qualify for Social Security depends on his or her age and the type of benefit. Any future Social Security benefit payment depends on a person's earnings, averaged over a working lifetime. Generally, the higher a person's earnings, the higher his or her Social Security benefit will be. And remember that Social Security is more than retirement. If a worker becomes disabled before reaching retirement age, he or she may be eligible for Social Security disability benefits. A disabled worker's spouse and dependent children also may be eligible for benefits. If a worker dies, the widow or widower and dependent children may be eligible for Social Security survivors benefits. If you, or someone you know, were wounded while on active duty in the military, find out more about what Social Security can do by visiting our website designed specifically for wounded warriors: www.socialsecurity.gov/woundedwarriors. There, you will find answers to a number of commonly asked questions, as well as other useful information about disability benefits and Supplemental Security Income (SSI). Veterans and others who are within 10 years of retirement age should begin planning for retirement. A good place to start is with Social Security's Retirement Estimator at www.socialsecurity.gov/estimator.

CHICAGO HONORS AMERICA'S VETERANS NOV. 11 AT SOLDIER FIELD CEREMONY

Veterans Day is the one day set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military in wartime or peacetime. This year's ceremony honors those veterans who work tirelessly to acknowledge and assist these brave men and women each and every day. The ceremony will be held at the Doughboy statue inside Gate 0 of Soldier Field "on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month." (November 11, 2011 at 11a.m.)

The event's keynote speaker is Specialist U.S. Army (Retired) Danielle Green-Byrd, one of the first women wounded in the conflict in Iraq, earning a purple heart. Green-Byrd, a Chicago native who attended Roosevelt High School, was a standout basketball player for the University of Notre Dame, scoring 1000 points and making 500 rebounds. Upon her return, veterans' benefits afforded Green-Byrd the opportunity to obtain two Masters Degrees and pursue a career in counseling. She now works for the Department of Veterans Affairs as a Readjustment Counselor at the Orland Park Vets Center, an affiliate of Hines VA Hospital.

Also speaking is MSgt. Jean Albright, USAF (Retired), who completed 20 years of honorable service in the U.S. Air Force. While in the Air Force, Albright served in various roles including Manager of Public Affairs for the U.S. Military Entrance Processing Command at Great Lakes Naval Base in Illinois. As a member of the board of directors of the Service Members Legal Defense Network, a national organization which works on behalf of gay and lesbian service members, she worked toward the repeal of Don't Ask Don't Tell. She has been Director of New Media for Windy City Media Group in Chicago since 1994.



"A Theater Review"

"The Doyle and Debbie Show" **Royal George Cabaret Theatre** 1641 N. Halsted Street, Chicago, Illinois

If you're a person who goes to the theatre to have a good time - you like corny dialogue and country music, then this is the perfect show for you.

The show was created by Bruce Arnstson and this fast-paced ninety-minute musical stars Mr. Arnstson along with Jennie Littleton as Debbie and Matt Carlton as Doyle's sidekick.

The show offers all original songs such as "Just Keep Me," "Stock Car Love," "Barefoot and Pregnant," "Daddy's Hair," and "When You're Screwing Other Women, Think of Me." These are five of the sixteen songs the show has to offer patrons.

One critic sitting next to me was laughing up a storm. Another critic who believes all people from the south are hillbillies didn't use that word in his comments.

I remember the National Barn Dance that originated in Chicago long ago and when I was in Nashville I attended the Grand Old Opry. All these down home fun shows are long gone.

Do I Need to Plan If I Have Joint Tenancy Property?



We all have the friends or family that think they are the armchair experts on everything. They want to walk on your back when you are in agony. They told you Enron was a hot stock to buy. And, they tell you that all you need is to hold assets in joint tenancy.

Joint tenancy is a method of titling real estate, brokerage accounts, and other property. With joint tenancy, each joint tenant has an equal right to the property. At the death of one of the joint

tenants, the other joint tenant(s) automatically get(s) the interest of the owner who died. For example, Betty is a widow and she adds her son Ben as a joint tenant. Upon Betty's death, Ben would be the only remaining joint tenant and would have complete ownership of the property.

Joint tenancy is seemingly simple, the property passes automatically at death. However, it is not necessarily the best way to proceed. First, in this case, Ben's creditors can take their proportionate interest or can file suit for a partition or force a sale. This is especially problematic when a parent adds a child for "simplicity" and then ends up losing half the property when junior gets sued for a drunk driving accident.

The transfer into joint tenancy for some things, such as real estate, is a gift. If this gift is over \$13,000, a gift tax return must be filed. If joint tenancy is a bank account, there is a gift upon withdrawal by the other joint tenant. So, when Betty added Ben on the title, she made a gift to her son, Ben. If, down the road, Ben is taken off the title, he has made a gift back to his mother, Betty. This could be especially problematic if Betty is trying to qualify for Medicaid benefits, because a gift typically causes a period of ineligibility. Suddenly, this "simple" form of holding property is not so simple after all.

In addition to gifting concerns and creditors, Ben could get divorced and Ben's interest in the property could be part of that settlement.

A better solution would be to have Betty establish a revocable trust and put that property, among others, in the trust. The property still avoids probate and Betty can specify when and how Ben will get the property, yet his creditors will not be able to get it.


