




# Dan Parrilli does not recommend waiting 50 years for a hearing aid

Turning on his hearing aid for the first time was "literally a moment in time that I will never forget," said Dan Parrilli. To understand where Dan is coming from, it helps to know that Dan has lived with hearing loss since grade school—in the mid-1950s.

#### What Have I Been Missing?

Back in grade school, "conversation was not a problem," said Dan, and so a childhood hearing loss diagnosis was ignored. A few years later, in 1968, Dan received a draft notice. But after two hearing tests, the draft board declared him "1Y" – available for military service, but qualified only in the event of war or national emergency. When he wasn't sent to Vietnam because of his hearing loss, a mystified recruiter asked him, "Why don't you wear hearing aids?"

Dan knew he had hearing loss, but coped with it instead of seeking treatment. He asked people to repeat themselves and asked others what was being said. He made do, but didn't have any sense that he might be missing something. And since older hearing aids seemed to have a hit or miss quality to them, Dan simply didn't take the matter any further.



So Dan had his own hearing tested—more than 50 years after his childhood diagnosis. He had hearing loss in both ears and could not hear high frequencies. Dan's hearing care professional, Marie Vetter, Au.D., at Chicago Hearing Services, fitted him with ReSound LiNX2.

When Dan turned on his ReSound LiNX2 hearing aids, for the first time he heard everything. Dan had never heard birds chirping. He did not know there was a background sound to the television. All his life he had not been able to distinguish between the spoken "15" and "16," he was constantly asking his wife "one dash five or one dash six?"

#### **Technology Forward**

Today Dan could not be more pleased with his ReSound LiNX2 hearing aids. Besides hearing sounds for the very first time, some situations, such as going to a restaurant, stood out as totally different.

"Your brain hears the clatter of plates in back and says, 'I don't need to hear that." said Dan. "But my brain said, 'Hey, listen to that new sound!" Which at first was very distracting. But with ReSound LiNX2, he can diminish those distracting sounds with a touch of his iPhone. Dan typically uses the four programs his hearing care professional set for him and can switch between them through the ReSound Smart app. He also makes use of Apple's "Live Listen" setting on his iPhone to capture conversations in the middle of the table and direct them to his hearing aid. He also likes the ability find his hearing aids if he misplaces or loses them.

Having the ReSound LiNX2 has been a life-changing experience, according to Dan, who offered this final bit of wisdom: "You don't know what you're missing until you find out what you've missed."

# **Mayor Emanuel Announces New Early Childhood Education Site In West Ridge**

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Alderman Patrick O'Connor today joined the Department of Family and Support Services and Chicago Public Schools to announce a new early education center at Passages Elementary School – the fourth center to be announced this year. The centers provide quality early learning services, just as new data from CPS underscores the benefits of ramping up free pre-k for all the city's 4-year-olds.

"For decades Chicago children started school when they were six and had the shortest day and the shortest school year of any group of children in the country. With the gains we've made and by expanding free pre-k for all, they'll now be in class at 4 and have nearly four more years of classroom time by the time they graduate," said Mayor Emanuel. "This newest data reinforces why we're making these investments, which are fundamentally about giving every child from every neighborhood their best chance to succeed.

The new early education center at Passages Elementary School in the West Ridge community will serve approximately 100 children in the 2018-19 school year, and scale up to 160 children starting in the 2019 – 200 school year. Facilities and programs will also be developed to support the whole family, including a computer lab, and programming for Adult ESL, Workforce Development and Family Behavioral Health. The center will be run in conjunction with the K-8 charter school and Asian Human Services. Passages Elementary School is a global school open to everyone, with a focus on the needs of immigrant and refugee students.

"We know the long-term benefits of early education," said Department of Family and Support Services Commissioner Lisa Morrison Butler. "With the Mayor's support, we are working towards universal full-day pre-k for all of Chicago's youngest learners."

Capital investments in early education were recently released in the CPS budget, including the first year of funding towards making pre-k universal in Chicago. Chicago Public Schools recently proposed a nearly \$1 billion in capital plan —the district's largest single-year capital investment in more than two decades — to promote equitable access to high quality resources by investing in educational programming, overcrowding relief, facility maintenance, athletic spaces, and IT and security upgrades.

As the first step in Mayor Emanuel's ambitious plan to establish free pre-k for all 4-year-olds by 2021, CPS is expanding full-day pre-k next year to accommodate an additional 3,700 students. Across CPS and Chicago's community-based partners, roughly 15,000 of the city's 4-year-olds will have access to full-day pre-k programming. In the first year, expanded programming will focus on families of four who make less than \$46,435 per year.

Families can apply for preschool programs through the universal online application. This online site provides a single point of entry to access a comprehensive menu of over 600 programs for three-and four-year olds available under Chicago CPS, DFSS and city-administered community-based sites citywide. 

# New Lottery Game To Benefit Families Of Fallen Police Officers

Gov. Bruce Rauner today signed a bill to create a new Illinois Lottery scratch-off game from which proceeds will fund police memorials, support for the families of officers killed or severely injured in the line of duty, and protective vest replacements for officers.

"Our police officers stand in the face of danger every day to keep us safe. We are proud to stand with them and support their families when they are faced with a devastating loss," Rauner said. "This new ticket will help fund scholarships for their children and honor their bravery at memorial parks across the state."

The three designated police memorial funds provide support to families of officers who have been killed or severely injured in the line of duty.

"No dollar amount raised could ever replace a loved one who has paid the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty," said Illinois State Police Director Leo P. Schmitz. "The funds raised by this new bill will serve as a tribute to these fallen heroes for their sacrifice, and more importantly help future generations of police officers, their families and their children."

"We are proud to support the State of Illinois' new scratch-off lottery ticket to benefit the families and preserve the memories of our real-life heroes who lost their lives protecting others," Chicago Police Superintendent Eddie Johnson said on behalf of the Chicago Police Memorial Fund. "Nothing can replace the empty seat at the dinner table or fill the aching absence of these heroes. But we can remember their bravery, integrity and selfless service by memorializing their exceptional character through the scholarships and programs that will be assisted by this new lottery game."

The funds raised through this new scratch-off ticket will be used to build and maintain police memorials and parks, hold annual memorial commemorations, give scholarships to children of officers killed or severely injured in the line of duty, provide financial assistance to police officers and their families when a police officer is killed or injured in the line of duty, and provide financial assistance to officers to purchase or replace protective gear.

The new law goes into effect Jan. 1, 2019.





## **President Preckwinkle Delivers Remarks at Annual Event Honoring Vietnam-Era Military Veterans**

On August 1st, Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle recognized hundreds of Vietnam War-era veterans for their sacrifice and service to the nation as part of the national Vietnam War Commemoration She was joined at the event by Commissioner Jeff Tobolski

The veterans gathered at Chicago Botanic Garden and were saluted for their service in wartime.

"We are grateful to those who fought and served with honor during the Vietnam era," Preckwinkle said. "This ceremony is a symbol of our appreciation for the sacrifices that you and your families made as we reflect on your service to our nation."

"As Chairman of the Board's Veterans Committee, it is my great honor to host this recognition ceremony of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War,' Tobolski said. "Today and every day, I am humbled by your selflessness and thank you for your service to the United States."

The ceremony was part of a national program that recognizes Vietnam veterans. The 2008



National Defense Authorization Act authorizes the Secretary of Defense to conduct a commemorative program that honors the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War throughout the U.S. Cook County is a commemorative partner in the program.

The commemoration honors the service of the U.S. armed forces during the Vietnam War, acknowledges the contributions made by the people of the U.S. during the war, recognizes technological and scientific advances related to military research conducted during the Vietnam War, and recognizes U.S. allies during the war.

The veterans each received several items, including a lapel pin inscribed with the words, "A Grateful Nation Thanks and Honors You."

The event was organized by Tobolski and Bill Browne, Director of the Cook County Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA).

Preckwinkle created the County's first-ever Department of Veterans Affairs in 2013. The DVA works with Cook County employee-veterans and collaborates with veterans organizations in providing information for and helping direct veterans to programs and benefits based on their military service.

## New Law Eases Concerns About Liability In **Emergency Epipen Use**

Gov. Bruce Rauner signed into law today a bill to protect prescribing medical authorities from civil or professional liability when a police officer delivers an epinephrine auto-injection during an allergy-related emergency. The bill also clarifies protection already afforded to police officers.

Senate Bill 2226 is intended to expand availability of the life-saving, first-responder program originally implemented in January 2017 under what is more commonly known as Annie LeGere's Law. Annie LeGere was just 13 when she died in August 2015 after suffering a severe allergic reaction, likely to something she'd eaten, during a sleepover.

Today's bill signing took place in Elmhurst, where Annie attended Sandburg Middle School.

"Inspired by Annie's tragic and likely preventable passing, food allergy advocates worked with members of the Illinois General Assembly to pass Annie LeGere's Law," Rauner said. "The amendments included in SB 2226 should make availability of these life-saving devices more widespread by removing hesitancy among members of the medical prescribing community and increasing confidence among the officers who receive the advanced training needed to administer them.'

The nonprofit Food Allergy Research & Education estimates nearly 15 million people living in the U.S., 6 million of them children, are food allergy sufferers. Food allergies result in more than 300,000 ambulance trips to hospitals annually for children under 18. Epinephrine has been proven effective as a first line of treatment for anaphylactic reactions due to allergy.
